

WHANGANUI INTERMEDIATE SCHOOL ENROLMENT ZONE

The zone is that area bounded by a line drawn down the centre of Carlton Avenue from the Whanganui River, Parsons Street, Surrey Road and a line extending through Mosston Road (not including Buxton Road) to include Belmont Road and Taylor Road and in a line to Great North Road (including Pickwick Road and Dickens Lane) and in a line to Papaiti Road (including Flemington Road and Papaiti Road to Raorikia) and in a line drawn down the middle of the Whanganui River to Riverbank Road at the Mateongaonga Stream and in a line to the junction of No 3 Line with Wakefield Street and Eastown Road to No 2 Line (including Burtts Road) to State Highway 3 (including Marybank Road) and in a line to include Airport Road and in a line to the middle of the Whanganui River to Carlton Avenue.

Enrolments for all Home Zone and Out of Zone students should be in to the school office **no later than Thursday 18 October (week one term four)**.

If a ballot is required it will be held on Friday 19 October.

All parents will have their child's enrolment confirmed within seven working days of the ballot being held.

OUT OF ZONE ENROLMENTS - BALLOTING PROCEDURES

Each year the board will determine the number of places which are likely to be available in the following year for the enrolment of students who live outside the home zone. The board will publish this information by notice in a daily or community newspaper circulating in the area served by the school. The notice will indicate how applications are to be made and will specify a date by which all applications must be received.

Applications for enrolment will be processed in the following order of priority:

| 1 st priority | This priority category is not available at this school because the school does not run a special programme approved by the Secretary. |
| 2 nd priority | will be given to applicants who are siblings of current students. |
| 3 rd priority | will be given to applicants who are siblings of former students. |
| 4 th priority | will be given to any applicant who is a child of a former student of the school. |
| 5 th priority | will be given to applicants who are either a child of an employee of the board of the school or a child of a member of the board of the school. |
| 6 th priority | will be given to all other applicants. |

If there are more applicants in the first, second, third or fourth priority groups than there are places available, selection within the priority group will be by ballot conducted in accordance with instructions issued by the Secretary under Section 11G(1) of the Education Act 1989. Parents will be informed of the date of any ballot by notice in a daily or community newspaper circulating in the area served by the school.
